Preserving a Legacy of Safety Net Collaboration in Suburban Ramsey County

- SRFC continually assesses community needs, formalizes systems of care, builds community capacity and engages new partners to support children, youth and families whose health, learning, safety and security are at risk.
- As Keepers of the Safety Net we listen to our stakeholders, strategically partner and create innovative solutions to address gaps that only collaboration can produce.
- As needs change, so does the focus of the collaborative. Action-research and data, drive decision making.

2012-2013 School-Linked Program Data

183 students served with School-Linked Mental Health Services.

 Helping to improve a child's overall stress, emotional distress, hyperactivity, and attention difficulties.

159 families with 251 children/youth served by School-Linked Community Social Workers (CSW).

- Nearly 1/3 of the families CSWs work with report they are homeless or facing an eviction at intakes. Of those families, 61% found stable housing at follow-up.
- 42% of households were using SNAP food support at intake. CSWs do an outstanding job of connecting qualifying families to a variety of food assistance programs, with 96% of families meeting their basic food needs at follow-up.

39,040 students and parents through direct services (greatly exceeding our goals of serving a total of 4,000 students and 2,000 family members).



Moving forward together....

- Our Community Support Center and Heading Home SUBURBAN Ramsey partnerships are mobilizing a multi-sector initiative where neighbors help neighbors achieve long term housing stability. We will need more support from all sectors (i.e. faith community, government, business and employers, people in poverty, communities of color, education, foundations, and nonprofits) to continue this important work.
- Continuing to pilot our Resource Table with practitioners has potential to create a strong civic engagement tool and collective database with up-to-the-minute resources. We will need our partners to continue to utilize and inform this database on a regular basis.
- Our School-Linked Intensive Mental Health and Community Social Worker Initiatives play a critical role in our ability to respond to children and youth's mental health and family's basic needs. Finding local, state and federal funding sources to enhance these services is the ongoing challenge.

SRFC improved or maintained 77% of our performance indicators set at baseline.


Greatest gains made in:

- school safety
- physical and verbal violence reports
- students with school aversion
- school connectedness across all districts

Student climate survey data: An impetus for change at the district & school building level.

We were able to directly impact students, families and schools with the implementation of consortia-wide evidence based strategies such as PBIS, Second Step, Incredible Years, and with best-practice family engagement strategy, The Family Project; and best-practice truancy prevention, Truancy Intervention Program (TIP) in closer partnership with Ramsey County Attorney's Office (RCAO).
